This student handbook is a very important tool for learning at ESLplus. It is a set of information for all our students to be used as reference from time to time.

Both international and local students are warmly received into our Summer Program and we value this opportunity of meeting other cultures. ESLplus recognizes that the learning it provides today needs to prepare all students for life in a global world.

Our aim is to **provide quality language instruction best suited to the needs of our students.** We stress the importance of relevant, practical and communicative curriculum supported by all the important language, cultural and social aspects of education.

At ESLplus, we aim to prepare our students for potential language and social opportunities and to provide international students with the necessary communication skills and fluency in English to succeed in their goals. International students will be fully supported in their learning and well cared for.

Established in 2003, ESLplus is a private educational institution primarily for English as a second language (ESL) learners, and later evolved into a service provider for private tutorials for both residents and international students of Canada. ESLplus also offers Homestay Program, teacher training programs through the Academy of Teaching and Training, ESL programs for students, teens and adults, corporate training for companies and educational organizations, and resources/ workshops for ESL teachers. aim of the program

***Note:** ESLplus has the right to deny applications if it has reached its maximum number of students or if the same culture or language group has reached its limit of number of students. This is to make sure that there is no dominant culture or language group in our program.

two very important rules

Rule #1: All students need to attend REGULARLY and arrive ON TIME. It is important to students to arrive on time for program. Regular and punctual attendance is an important life skill for all students. If you know that you will be late or absent, please phone the program director or e-mail admin@eslplus.ca.

Regular program hours are from 9am to 4pm. Students are not allowed on program property before 8:30 am or after 4:10pm.

Rule #2: We adopt ENGLISH ONLY policy during our summer program. Students must speak English at all times during our summer program. This is to encourage our students to practice their English skills even with their classmates who may speak the same native language.

dress code

Students are encouraged to wear casual, weather-appropriate, comfortable clothes. Note: Female students are to wear modest, proper clothes for language learning. We have children and teens attending our language camps in the same building, so please set an example to our young students by wearing proper attire.

attendance

All students are expected to **attend regularly** during their registered dates except for medical reasons. If a student is absent, please contact your Camp Director as soon as possible stating the reason for his absence. Or e-mail admin@eslplus.ca. Note: Absences or late days will not be refunded or made up on other days.

program property

All the rooms assigned to our program, including outdoor surroundings should be kept clean and tidy. Keep off all garden areas and other rooms in the school. Any form of vandalism will not be tolerated and will result to cancellation of the student's any remaining program days. You may be required to pay for damage costs upon full investigation of the case.

daily routine

Students are to participate actively in our program activities, scheduled trips, and day-to-day learning routines.

health issues

When students are in the program, they work and interact very closely to each other. If you are ill (e.g. influenza, coughs, colds), please stay at home so others would not be affected. **Sick or late days are not refundable.**

Teachers are not allowed to administer oral medication to students. All other injuries and illnesses will be coursed through emergency 911. (Ambulance costs will be paid by the insurance or by yourself, if required).

Any student who has symptoms of fever during program **should go home**. It is important that students have medical insurance in case of emergencies. It is highly recommended that students have their flu shots before attending our program.

program staff

- All our program directors and teachers are TESL/TESOL certified, qualified and experienced to teach English to all levels, all ages, and in all settings.
- Volunteers and assistant teachers underwent criminal record check and were adequately trained to help during the summer program.
- Overall Director of ESLplus Programs: Irene Lardizabal, M Ed TESL. Irene has 22 years of ESL teaching experience in Asia, the Middle East and North America. She is a regular teacher trainer and speaker in TESL conferences across Canada.

length of study

ESLplus Summer Intensive English Program runs within the summer months, beginning late June. Students may start their course of study at any time during the program period (recommended: start on any Monday – or Tuesday if Monday is a holiday - and end on any Friday). All incoming, new students are assessed by the teachers.

ESL program

Our ESL classes are small – each group not more than 20, taught by one teacher, assisted by 1-2 teaching volunteers.

language assessment

The language test has all components of language communication: speaking, listening, reading and writing. Students are evaluated and then placed either in the beginning, intermediate or advanced level.

homework

Students are encouraged to complete their homework when assigned. Homework is important to follow up on learned topics or skills in the classroom.

volunteers

Volunteers are an asset in our program. Volunteers provide assistance in classrooms and field trips. We are always grateful to people who offer their help, whether it's once during the week or everyday. If you have some time and interest in volunteering, sign up with the teacher or give us a call or e-mail, and we'll find just the right opportunity for you to get involved.

As per government and ESLplus policies, all volunteers must submit recent criminal record check.

visiting the program

For the students's safety, all family members or friends of registered students are to call or e-mail us first before visiting. Visiting kin or friends are not allowed to linger anywhere inside the school during program hours.

food for learning

Good food is fuel for good learning. Breakfast every day will produce the energy needed for active learning and growing. A healthy packed lunch and nutritious snacks are also important parts of supporting learning during the program. Think smart food, not junk food! Students are always welcome to have a bottle of water on their desks. Note: Please inform our staff if you have food or drink allergies for precaution.

behavioural expectations

All ESLplus staff and students must:

- Respect and comply with all applicable federal, provincial and municipal laws of Canada
- Demonstrate honesty and integrity
- Respect the differences in people, their ideas and opinions
- Treat one another with dignity and respect of all times, and especially when there is a disagreement
- Respect and treat others fairly, regardless of their race, ancestry, place of origin, colour, citizenship, religion, gender, sexual orientation, age or disability
- Respect the rights of others
- Show proper care and regard for the school facilities and the property of others
- Take appropriate measures to help those in need
- Respect persons who are in a position of authority
- Respect the need of others to work in an environment of learning and teaching

Guests at the program are expected to:

- Show proper respect and courtesy to all ESLplus staff and students
- Request for appointment by e-mail or by phone if they wish to speak to the teachers
- Cooperate with and follow ESLplus regulations as stipulated in this handbook

early returns and dismissal policy

Students may be asked to leave the school premises or expelled from the program for unacceptable behaviour. Any of the following will definitely be considered as reasons for early return, or, after appropriate warnings, expelled from the program (in program and/or homestay settings):

- Lack of or no interest or participation in class activities and homework
- Uttering a threat to inflict serious bodily harm on another person
- Possessing alcohol or illegal drugs
- Being under the influence of alcohol
- Swearing at a teacher or classmate, homestay host or other person in a position of authority (in English or native language)
- Committing an act of vandalism that causes extensive damage to program or homestay house property
- Possessing a weapon, including a firearm
- Using a weapon to cause or to threaten bodily harm to another person

- Committing sexual assault or misconduct
- Committing a robbery
- Irregular attendance or habitual tardiness at program
- Violence or impolite behaviour towards fellow students, teachers, homestay hosts and school staff
- Disregard of program rules
- Intentionally disrupting class routines

If an international student is advised of dismissal from the program, he or she is responsible to book an early flight back to their country. If the student refuses to cooperate, the student will be transferred to police. **Absolutely no refunds in this situation.**

things to bring

Recommended:

- swimwear, goggles, towel for swimming (some field trips have swimming facilities)
- Comfortable shoes for program, slippers for home use (for homestay students)
- Personal toiletries (for homestay students)
- Casual summer clothes and footwear (Canadians typically wear simple practical clothes during summer, e.g. shorts, jeans, t-shirts, flip flops, sandals, etc.)
- Backpack or bag for program study materials
- Pens, notebook, etc
- Dictionary (book or digital) – English and native language
- Photocopy of student's passport (for international students only) or photo ID (for local students)

Optional:

- Hat or cap, sunglasses for outdoor trips
- Sunscreen, lip balm, mosquito repellent
- Rainwear – thin raincoat or foldable umbrella
- Camera, binoculars – for field trips
- Pocket money
- Family pictures for conversation topics

Please do NOT bring:

- Illegal drugs, alcohol, firearms, knives, any sort of weapon, gambling paraphernalia, political promotional items
- iPods, walkmans, disc mans, radios, cell phones, Blackberries, pagers, handheld electronic games, DS, laptop, etc. (Not allowed in classroom during study hours, but permitted during breaks, outside the classroom and during field trips. These will be confiscated by the teacher if used in the classroom, to be claimed after 2 days. ESLplus is NOT responsible for loss or damage of these items.

about trips and outdoor activities

Conditions:

1. The students understand that the field trips may take place away from program facility; may involve transportation by school bus, private vehicle, common carrier or other mode of transportation; and may involve activities beyond the scope of traditional program activities conducted on program facility.
2. The students acknowledge that their participation in these field trips and outdoor activities potentially involve risks and obligations that are impossible to predict, but may include the risk of loss or damage to personal property and the risk of sickness, personal injury or death.
3. The students understand that ESLplus does not purchase, or have, any medical, dental, or hospitalization insurance to cover injuries to or loss of life of students or to indemnify students for expenses in connection therewith, and that such insurance, if desired, must be purchased by the students.

other important reminders students:

- The students give ESLplus their permission to use for promotional purposes any photographs or movies taken in the course of their participation in the summer program program.
- The students agree to release, waive, and discharge, ESLplus and/or their directors, staff and agents from all liability to the registered student, the student's personal representative, assigns, heirs, and next of kin for any medical loss, damage, injury, or even death caused during the summer program.
- The students understand that they will be subject to the laws of Canada. The students acknowledge and understand that should they fall into legal problems related to the summer program; the students will attend to the matter personally with their own personal funds.

Details:

Accommodation is provided to both local and international students through our Homestay Program. We have available Homestay host families in Toronto, Mississauga, Brampton, Oakville, and other GTA areas.

Our Homestay Program includes:

- Meticulous process in selection of homestay host families (visual inspection, criminal record background check, interviews, photos, English proficiency)
- Private bedroom (solo or shared): a comfortable bed (includes linen, blanket and a pillow), a work desk with chair and desk lamp with sufficient lighting, closet and a mirror
- 3 meals
- Laundry, TV, telephone and optional Internet use
- Airport pick-up and drop-off (extra cost)
- Free 30-minute overseas call to your family (phone card)
- Access to public transport
- Open communication between host and your family overseas (e-mail only)
- Homestay fees are to be paid minimum 2 weeks in advance to give the Homestay families the time and funds to prepare for your arrival.

refund policy

Full refund is available prior to 10 business days before selected program start date.

There are NO REFUNDS made within 10 business days of the start of the selected program week unless:

- (1) a physician's note can verify sickness as a reason for the cancellation or
- (2) the international student has been denied visa by the Canadian embassy.

Note:

Our program is not a "hunting" ground for potential boyfriends or girlfriends. Our program is an ESL program where we make English learning a priority. If you are simply looking for a place to hang out, or to simply socialize with other single men or women, this program is not for you. If during the program you complain about not meeting students of opposite sex, and you choose to quit the program, there are absolutely NO refunds for such a reason.

However, if the complaints are about learning and/or teaching English, these will be heard and investigated and appropriate refunds may apply.
